Regarding the other planned strike dates, further communications will be shared with parents nearer the time.


We will give parents as much advanced notice as possible, if school is affected.

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## Childhood illnesses

At present there are a number of illnesses that are prevalent in the community.

#### Conjunctivitis

We have been notified of a few cases of conjunctivitis in our Reception Class. Conjunctivitis can be very infectious and there is no public health requirement to stay off school. We are regularly sterilising our equipment in Early Years and encourage frequent handwashing. Please see NHS guidance and a pharmacist if you think your child may be affected.

#### **Scarlet Fever**

Scarlet Fever rates are high nationally and we have seen a few isolated cases of the illness. If you think your child has scarlet fever it is important to contact your GP. Your child should stay away from school until 24 hours after they begin to take an antibiotic.
