Thrive

In school, teachers will be having training on 'Thrive', which is a programme that promotes the well-being of children. This will focus on building positive relationships, increasing self-esteem and confidence to learn.

What is the Thrive approach?

Thrive uses a screening and monitoring tool called Thrive-Online[®] which identifies the developmental needs of individuals or groups and suggests actions plans to meet these needs.

At Kirklevington, we will begin by focussing on well-being activities that will benefit KS2 children as a whole class.

Teachers will be provided with strategies and age-appropriate activities to build into teaching to support social and emotional development.
