

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### **National Strike Action**

The National Education Union (NEU) are continuing with planned strike action, which will take place across dates in February and March. This strike action is in response to a national dispute between the union and the Government related to teachers pay, school funding and recruitment. Whilst Kirklevington Primary will be directly impacted by this strike, this action is not against the school or The 1590 Trust.

#### Wednesday 15th March

At present, all classes will be open as usual on these dates, and we will be unaffected by National Strike Action.

### Thursday 16th March

#### **BIRCH CLASS**

Regarding the other planned strike dates, I expect that <u>Birch Class will be closed to children on Thursday 16th March.</u>

The exception to this will be any child who is:

- On the SEND register;
- Pupil premium (registered free school meals);
- Open to social services;
- Parents are key workers and are both at work during the school day.

Children meeting this criteria will have adult supervision in school on that day and may come to school.

We apologise for any inconvenience. In the event that strike action does not go ahead, school will be open as normal.

All other classes will be open as normal on Thursday 16th March and attendance is expected.

## Parking at the car park next to the field

Stockton Borough Council will be placing three-way traffic lights on the A67 at the junction to the new development next to the school field, to control traffic flow in and out of the site.

The car park down Pump Lane will be still accessible, however the exit route will mean queueing traffic outwards, due to the temporary traffic lights.

This is expected to last approximately 3 weeks.


